An Overview of Day 2-3

ECOSOC

Topics: Transforming the Economics and Governance of Water in the context of the African Crisis, Addressing the challenges of a transition to a green and circular economy in developing countries. On day 2 we completed lobbying for our second topic and started debating, which went better than expected. We passed both of yesterday's resolutions regarding topic 1. Today we had some funny debates to warm up and debated on our 2nd resolutions. In the end, we read gossips and decided on the funny award winners.

UNDP

Topics: 'Future proofing': enhancing disaster risk reduction and resilience schemes in crisis-affected states, Bridging the gender digital divide to ensure protection of SDGs.

The UNDP committee has successfully passed all four resolutions! We had an excellent debate and a wonderful cooperation! We thank our delegates for their participation and we hope they had as an amazing experience as we had!

COP28

Topics: Keeping global warming to the 1.5 degrees Celsius threshold, Phasing out of all fossil fuels. On the second day of the conference we finished lobbying and voted on both of the resolutions of the first topic. We also read quite a few gossips. On the third day we finished both the resolutions for the second topic and then did our funny awards and read more gossips.

COUNCIL OF MARVEL

Topics: Vibranium: Measures to prevent its trafficking, The issue of providing asylum to Skrull refugees. On Day 2, we debated on 3 resolutions regarding both of our topics. They all passed successfully, and the debate that was held was very productive. All superhero "delegates" were highly participative and constantly showed their engagement via speeches and questions with meaningful content. On Day 3, we debated on one resolution about our second topic, which came really near to passing. We moved on with our committee crisis, the lobbying for which is currently ongoing. We are expecting a comprehensive resolution and an engaging debate.

UNEP

Topics: AI in the service of creating a healthy environment and preventing future disease outbreaks, Reversing forest loss and degradation.

Yesterday, we finished lobbying for the second topic, and we debated 2 resolutions. All the debates conducted were very productive with minimal disruptions. Today, we debated on our last resolution. The final debate was by far the most productive, as all the delegates submitted amendments, raised POIs and made speeches. After finishing, we started doing funny debate and gossip box. That was a delightful ending to this wonderful conference.

SECURITY COUNCIL

Topics: Establishing a global response framework against terrorism and violent extremism, The situation in Libya.

On day 2, we finished debating on the first topic, and started debating on the second one. On day 3, we finished our second resolution and underwent a crisis.

UNICEF

Topics: Safeguarding education in emergencies and crises, Ending child poverty.

On the second day, the delegates engaged in fruitful debate on three out of the four drafted resolutions. All of which passed with the majority of the house voting in favour. On the third day, the delegates completed debate on the final resolution, that also passed with flying colours. Then, the gossips from the gossip box were read and the Funny Award results were announced. For the rest of the day, UNICEF proceeded with debate practice on unique and funny topics.

GA1

Topics: Hybrid Warfare: the future of war, Developing a multilateral agreement against the use of explosive weapons in populated areas.

On Saturday the DISEC committee debated on both resolutions of the first topic, two out of three of the second topic and after intense debate passed one resolution while on day 3, we finished our last resolution and read the gossip box.

GA3

Topics: Ethics of AI technologies and its human rights implications, Prevention of enforced disappearances in conflict affected zones.

Unfortunately, today was the last day. We finished the debate of the fourth resolution, read the gossip box, and joined the session of General Assembly. Overall, the debate was heated and fruitful and we thank our wonderful delegates for the work and effort they put into this conference.

GA4

Topics: Addressing the issue of green colonialism, Discussing the repercussions of international intervention in cases of state sovereignty violation.

On the 2nd Day, we started debating on the topic of green colonialism with that taking up the half of our day. Both resolutions passed with an overwhelming majority. Further, the Committee had much fun discussing current topics that interested them. On the last day, we finished debating the second topic. Both resolutions passed again and we had a 100 percent participation rate. The resolution we sent to the GA plenary was Topic 1 resolution 2.

GA6

Topics: Application of universal jurisdiction for war crimes in Ukraine, The challenges of ownership and restitution of cultural artifacts.

The resolution which the legal committee submitted to the ga concerning "the application of universal jurisdiction for war crimes against Ukraine" has resulted in a heated debate. The discourse around this topic has been frantic and the ga participation is off the roof.
